Spring Consul John Parker, F.L.S., has announced plans for the rest of the year's activities.

"Although most of the time and effort has thus far been spent in organizing the club, some definite ideas and projects have been proposed," John commented.

"These include an oracle or fortune-telling booth at the spring ICC fair in May, and a Roman banquet that month also," he continued.

For money-raising projects the NLHS plans an evening "spectacular" movie, or possibly "selling honors" to first and second year Latin students.

"The idea of a city-wide Latin conference which was discussed in February has aroused much interest, and it is being seriously considered," John revealed.

"At present, however, we are faced with the problem of attendance," John stated.

"It is imperative that we have more members at meetings," mentioned John, "as the proposals and activities will require the full support of all club members."

## New Proposal

### PRAETOR TO GOVERN BEGINNING STUDENTS

Up to this time, the Praetor (v.p.) has been delegated little actual power within the Honor Society. The Praetorship is facing possible elimination because of the actions of those who feel that his principle duty (reading the role at meetings) should be delegated to the Scriptor.

To combat this idea, and to serve another purpose, a new plan is currently being formulated which would place the Praetor in a position of more importance.

As the proposed plan stands, the Praetor would act as head of the "REGENCY COUNCIL" consisting of two elected first and second year Latin students, and one additional member of the NLHS.

The REGENCY COUNCIL would serve as officers of the National Junior Classical League (for first and second year students) which would be organized as an associate group of the NLHS.

The two groups would have a common treasury, and all activities would be coordinated so that there would be no conflicting plans.

Rather than have two Latin clubs in the school and many would prefer the Honor Society open

only to upper class students, it is felt that a unified club with two divisions would be able to effectively organize both lower and upper classmen.

The official title of the new group would be the National Junior Classical League. While upper classmen would retain the National Latin Honor Society title, they would also be members of the Junior Classical League; however, only third and fourth year students would be in the Honor Society.

All members of the NLHS are asked to seriously consider this proposal for possible use next year.

At the present time, membership in the Grant Chapter of the NLHS is satisfactorily controlled by the requirements voted in the constitution.

Next fall, however, certain difficulties will arise because of the unusual wording of the constitution.

Under the revisions instituted in December, the members of the society must be currently taking either third or fourth year Latin and must receive a 90% average in the FIRST GRADING PERIOD. Therefore next year, the present junior members of the NLHS (who will be seniors in the fall), and the sophomores who next year will be taking third year Latin

will have to wait until after the first grading period before the chapter can be organized again.

This is a wasted seven week period.

It is suggested therefore that after plans for the ICC fair, the movie, and the banquet are complete, some thought should be given to a new system of membership requirements.

Possibly a tentative plan can be worked out where those taking third year Latin next year, can immediately become a member of the NLHS if they have had a 90% average or better in second year Latin.

Also, an installation program is definitely necessary.
