Two students (names unknown), represented Jeff at the Language Festival last month.

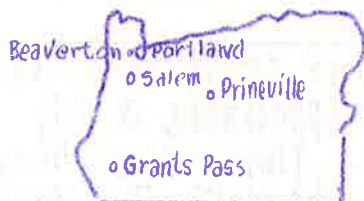
An "eat up time" is planned as the final activity before the installation of fall officers.

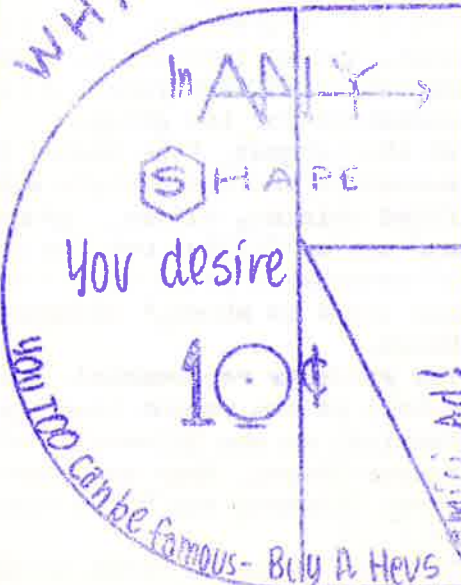
